Course Description

This course will expand on the topics covered in IET 2449, leading students to a deeper understanding of logistics and supply chain systems. Special emphasis will be given to current trends in the field, such as global logistics, reverse logistics, nontraditional supply chains, and risk assessment/disaster recovery. Each student will also research in more depth a single topic that interests them.

This semester's topics include:

- Local/Georgia Logistics
- Global Logistics
- Reverse Logistics
- Risk Assessment/Mitigation and Disaster Recovery in the Supply Chain
- Sustainable Supply Chains
- Nontraditional Supply Chains

Course Learning Outcomes

Upon successful completion of the course, students will be able to:

1. Demonstrate a knowledge of contemporary issues in logistics
2. Research a chosen topic in logistics and report the findings in an effective manner
3. Communicate effectively about logistics topics; both verbally and in writing

Term Project

Assignments

There will be ~4 guest speaker memos and potentially one or two other small assignments during the semester. If you miss a class where there is a guest speaker it is your responsibility to contact me for a different assignment.

On-Line Quizzes

After each pre-recorded lecture there will be a short quiz to complete before attending live lecture. The lowest score will be “dropped”.

Participation/Attendance

This course is very interactive, and your participation is a major component of your grade. The grade is split into your in-class participation (attendance and contribution to the live class discussion), your WebCT discussion board participation, and your critique of classmates’ paper rough drafts and final presentations (see the ‘Term Project’ module for further information).

Attendance to the live portion of the course is REQUIRED, as is timely viewing of the pre-recorded material. Students who miss class for any reason are NOT exempt from the material covered during the class period(s) the student misses. The instructor is NOT responsible for assisting the student to catch up on class material when the student is absent from class. There are only 15 live classes, so after the first unexcused absence, each additional unexcused absence will reduce your course grade by 5 points. Frequent tardiness will also negatively affect your grade.

Grading Policy

Your final grade in this course will be determined using the following weights for each component of this course:
